September

Possibly named for the Roman goddess of fertility - Maia

October

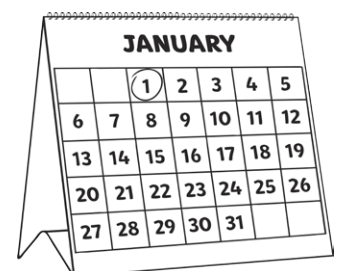
Named for an old Italian god, indicates the purification time of year - Februus

November

From the Latin for nine - novem

December
