<p><i>Improved attainment of PPG pupils in line with non-PPG: To increase the proportion of PPG pupils who make at least good progress so that they begin to achieve at least in line with other pupils nationally/move closer towards this point.</i></p>	<p>All children made expected or above expected progress in reading, writing and maths.</p> <p>50% of PP pupils make ARE in RWM</p> <p>Phonics data – all PP children in Year 2 passed the phonics screening check.</p>
<p><i>Improve standard of quality first teaching through curriculum planning: To ensure all curriculum areas have a clear intention to enable for a progression of skills and the appropriate acquisition of knowledge for PPG pupils.</i></p>	<p>Curriculum review undertaken – Big Ideas created – every subject has a clear set of progressive curriculum drivers.</p> <p>As a result, key knowledge and vocabulary will be identified for each topic. Clear acquisition of knowledge for all pupils established allowing for further adaptations and information sharing for pupils.</p>
<p><i>To create an open culture in which to share best practice: To ensure that there is consistency of best practice for all PPG pupils.</i></p>	<p>Consistency of practice across the school – regular monitoring of lessons, book looks and pupil voice, show consistency of approach in key areas – Maths, English, Behaviour.</p>

<p><i>Improved aspirations for all PPG pupils: To enable PPG pupils to see themselves as citizens of the world, where they aspire to 'do all the good they can'.</i></p>	<p>Tracking of children attending clubs, extra activities and visits in place. Impact seen through the specific and targeted clubs and trips that are in place for PP children (Sports Clubs, Art club, Residential trips (x3), Scooting Club, Cooking Club, Authors and Illustrators Club)</p> <p>Working in conjunction with external club providers to support children to attend with fully funded places.</p> <p>Over 20 clubs available for children to attend including before school, lunch time, after school</p> <p>Impact also seen through continuously new and adapted clubs being introduced to children throughout the year (Scooting Club)</p>
<p><i>To achieve and sustain improved attendance for all pupils, particularly our disadvantaged pupils</i></p>	<p>Pupil Attendance for disadvantaged pupils continue to rise. PP attendance – 94.8%. Non PP attendance – 96.0%. There was a 0.5% increase in PP attendance from the previous year.</p>
