

## Where are we?




## A family home, built in 1787...

## Today




Burwell House welcomes around **80 primary schools on residential visits each year**, from right across East Anglia, and beyond.

Along with the wide variety of youth and adult groups who use the Centre at weekends and during the school holidays we host a total of **4000 visitors per year**.

Schools staying with us have:

- **Sole residential occupancy** – each school staying here will be the only school staying here.
- Use of our **fantastic house** and its 3 acres of **wonderful gardens**.
- Support from a **caring, professional Centre staff** team.
- Freedom to plan a timetable that suits their curriculum, their topics and their individual children – our **courses are built for your school**.

## High quality, accredited service



One of the 3 Centres within this partnership (Burwell House, Grafham Water Centre and Stibbington) all working together to bring learning to life for children from Cambridgeshire and beyond.

## The House

- No longer a family home - though all the staff strive to make it feel like one.
- Grand, beautifully decorated, comfortable, warm, and homely.
- Protected by modern, sensitive fire alarm system and sprinklers.
- Secure – house is locked overnight by school staff, with grounds secured behind large wall and locked gates.

## Downstairs



- 2 large lounges and a separate classroom.
- Separate toilets for boys, girls and accompanying adults.
- Cloakroom.
- Dining room and conservatory



## Upstairs



- 11 bedrooms in total, of various different shapes and sizes.
- All with close access to their own shower and toilet facilities.




## The gardens

**Snacks** - these are provided throughout the day – there is no need to pack any for the trip.




## Evenings and overnight

# Medical Information

We will be sending out medical forms in the next few days!

Prescribed medication only (completed on the medical form)  
Enough for 3 days, 2 nights.

Given to a member of staff on the morning of our departure;  
if you want to do this beforehand you can.

Original container and clearly labelled with child's name and dosage.

Please make us aware of travel sickness.

# Contact

In the unlikely event of an emergency, staff will contact the school and someone will contact you directly. If outside of school hours, then a member of staff will contact you directly.

There will not usually be any direct contact between home and Burwell. If you need to contact your child, please phone the school who will pass on the message to us.

Pupils **MUST NOT** bring their own mobile phones with them.

## Kit List

You will receive a kit list for the trip in the next couple of days. Your child will need all of the things specified on the list. If you are struggling to get something, please let us know.

- Pupils will be dropped off at the hall on Wednesday 19<sup>th</sup> March with their bags. We will register and take in medication at this time.
